

24 hour urine collection information sheet

- The container should contain a small amount of preservative for the appropriate tests (if required) - <u>do not discard this preservative</u> (powder or small amount of liquid).
- 2. The <u>first</u> urine passed after getting up in the morning <u>should not</u> be collected.
- 3. From then on, <u>all urine passed</u> during the next 24 hours should be collected into the container provided.
- 4. The collection will be completed when the urine passed after getting up the following morning is collected into the container.
- 5. The complete collection should be taken to <u>Central Specimen Reception</u> on the ground floor of the Bessemer Wing at King's College Hospital.
- 6. It is essential that the urine collection is properly labelled with the following information:

Your name

Your date of birth

Your hospital number (if available)

Date and time when the urine collection was started and finished

Ward or GP name

Consultant / GP name

Please note, any unlabelled urine collections received will be discarded and will not be tested

- 7. A test request form must be handed in with the collection.
- 8. If a **creatinine clearance** has been requested, a blood sample should either be taken at the end of the collection (in-patient) or when the collection is brought to Central Specimen Reception (out-patient).
- 9. If **5HIAA** testing is requested, the following should be avoided for a 24 hour period prior to the start of the collection, as well as during the collection: avocados, bananas, pineapples, plums, walnuts, tomatoes, kiwi fruit, sweetcorn, broccoli, spinach and aubergine (egg plant).
